# System of Recognition in Lithuania

Academic  
recognition

- SKVC: qualifications
- Higher education institutions: periods of study, RPL, qualifications (restricted to authorised HEI)

Professional  
recognition

- Competent authorities: regulated professions
- Employers (*de facto*): non-regulated professions

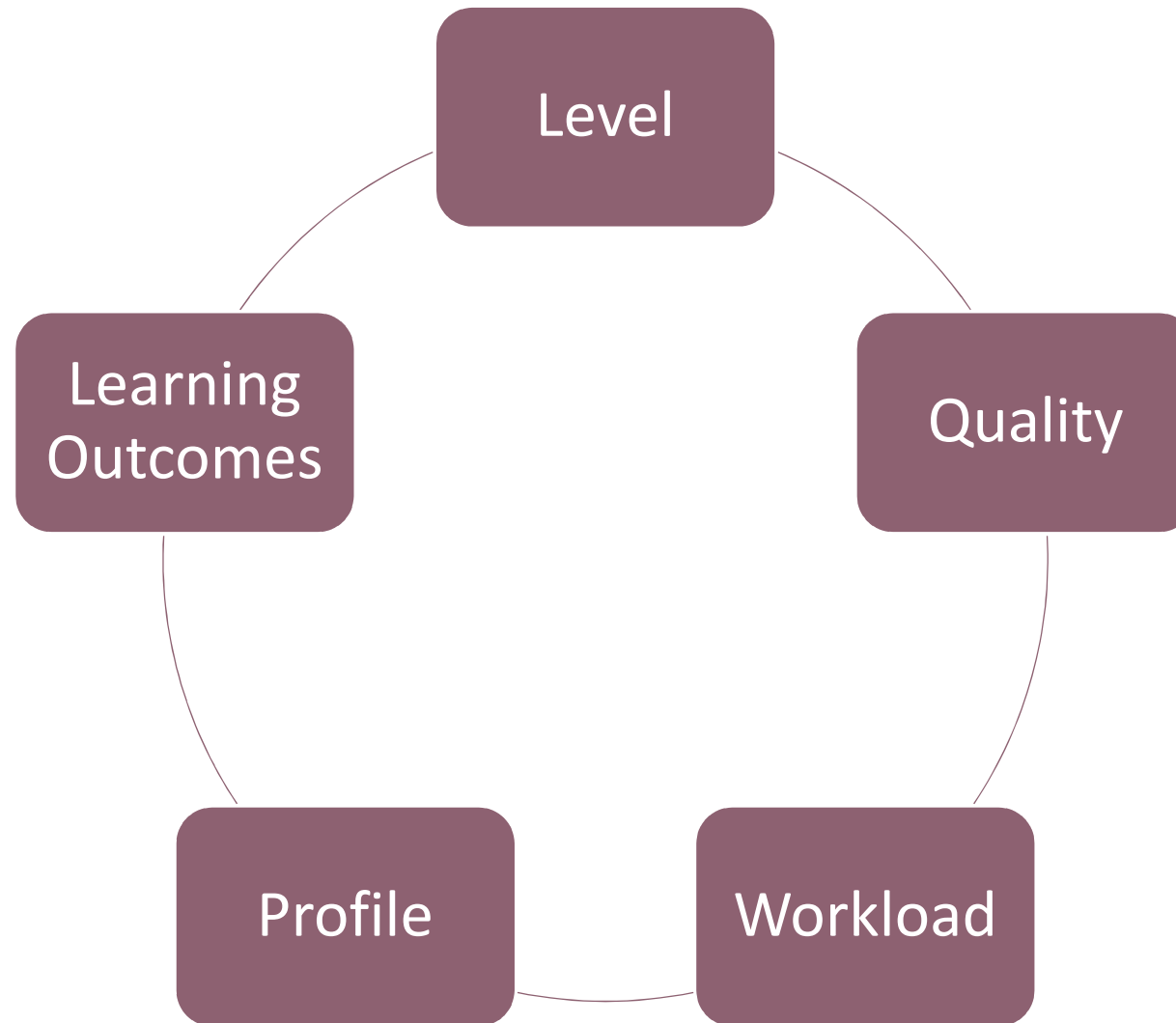


# Development and Implementation of Best Practice

# Learning Outcomes Approach in Recognition

- Comparability not equivalency
- Focus on the result (outcome) not the process (input)
- Trust in the quality assurance systems of other countries
- No detailed scrutiny of contents of the programs and manner of their delivery
- This allows us to recognise qualifications, which differ in terms of acquisition, but are comparable in terms of result





*Recognition of foreign qualifications should not focus on a detailed assessment of formal criteria related to the foreign qualification, but should, as much as possible, take into consideration what a person knows, understands, and is able to do. This can be achieved by taking into consideration the learning outcomes of qualifications. (EAR Manual HEI)*
